The Music Service can provide curriculum music teaching, delivered by specialist teachers:

'The Power of Music to Change Lives: A National Plan for Music Education' (NPME) builds on the original 2011 plan with an updated vision: 'To enable all children and young people to learn to sing, play an instrument and create music together, and have the opportunity to progress their musical interests'. There is **a focus on early years settings,** and a strong narrative about progression through school into a life-long appreciation and/or professional career in music.

The DfE expect timetabled curriculum of at least one hour each week of the school year for key stages 1-3

Developing executive function is crucial for both learning and wellbeing

Ofsted says that well-developed executive function skills can lead to better educational attainment and a healthier life. Executive function (EF) is a set of cognitive skills that help us to do things like:

- manage our own time
- switch between tasks
- multitask
- prioritise tasks
- regulate emotions
- pay attention or remain on task
- remember details
- control our impulses

Music and learning an instrument is an ideal way of developing executive function.

'Musicians have also demonstrated an advantage on broad cognitive abilities such as executive functions. Research evidence supports a strong association between enhanced working memory performance in musicians compared to non-musicians. Improved working memory was found across age groups, including children'.
