General:

BEFORE BOOKING Please note – We will always do our best to accommodate requests from schools but it is impossible for us to offer an afternoon session to every school. Please keep this in mind when ordering provision and try to be as flexible as possible. This will enable us to provide teaching for as many schools as possible.

As well as terms and conditions specific to projects as set out in each section, the following will apply:

The Music Service will:

- Provide teaching over a minimum of 34 weeks and a maximum of 36 weeks.
- Support Music in your school.
- Support the class teacher to assess progress during projects.
- Deliver and collect instruments.
- Monitor the quality of teaching provided.
- Carry out stock checks of instruments being used by the school in line with MK Council internal audit requirements.
- Provide a planning overview where requested.

Schools will:

- Provide appropriate space and resources for the class/group to ensure a good learning environment.
- Prioritise booking a Whole Class Ensemble Programme. (IN3A, IN3B, IN3C, IN3F & IN3G).
- Ensure a member of staff supports the delivery of all WCET projects (IN3A, IN3B, IN3C, IN3F & IN3G). This can be a teaching assistant or a class teacher but needs to be the same member of staff every week.
- Ensure all pupils who have received WCET have the opportunity to continue with instrumental lessons.
- Ensure that all children have equal access to music sessions.
- Ensure class teachers are aware of pupil progress during music projects.
- Provide details of the school's behavioural policy.
- Provide details about each class - names, SEND, behaviour etc.
- Ensure that all Music Service instruments are checked on arrival and departure, are signed for and are part of the school's audit procedures.
- Continue support in music sessions for those pupils that need it (including 1:1 support).
- Complete the annual Arts Council return.
- Support the Headstart Project for WCET groups.

Length of Agreement:

When booking, schools commit to the agreed programme for the period advertised.

Method and timing of payments:

Schools will be invoiced on a termly basis. The Music Service will supply schools with written confirmation of services purchased.
